

IN MEMORIAM

lan Smith writes: "I am confident that many Ringmer residents will have known David and Gwen Smith. Along with their two sons, they moved to Ringmer in 1966 and enjoyed many happy years in the village. David and Gwen immersed themselves in local community activities and were part of the Ringmer church congregation.

"Sadly, David's health began to fail and in 2010, they moved to a flat in the centre of Chichester. Leaving Ringmer was a really difficult decision but with David and Gwen settled in Chichester, the whole family were able to provide support. David died in 2013 and Gwen continued to live a busy life where she joined, volunteered and helped with a whole host of nearby activities and attended her local church at St Pancras, Chichester.

ST MARY'S ECO TIP FOR APRIL

Following on from the great garden birdwatch, early spring is the time to think about putting up a nest box. You can buy boxes online or from garden centres or you can make one yourself – check out the Sussex Wildlife website for instructions. Think about which birds come frequently to the feeders. Blue tits need a hole in the front of the box of 25mm, great tits 28mm, sparrows 38mm but robins and wrens like an open-fronted box. The box must face North or East, not directly into the sun. For tits it can be on a wall or tree trunk between 2 and 5 metres from the ground, well away from potential predators such as cats. Robins like the box to be well hidden in undergrowth or ivy. Old boxes should be thoroughly cleaned out each year. It's so exciting if the box attracts a family and if you are clever you can rig up a camera to watch the birds on screen.

RINGMER AGAINST GREENFIELD EXPLOITATION



Many readers will be apprehensive about the accessibility of the popular footpaths on the Thakeham 1 Site, off Bishops Lane (LW/21/0694). We can confirm that the key, long distance routes which will be kept open, albeit diverted, are the following: Tile Kiln to Norlington (15), Tile Kiln to Broyle Lane (16), Tile Kiln to the Green Man,(16/17), Clarks Croft to Broyle Lane (18/16) and Clarks Croft to Norlington (18/15).

A big thank you to all who responded to LDC Draft Local Plan Consultation. If you've seen the thank you published by Lewes District Council to residents, be aware that it contains numbers that could be misunderstood - the '42,000 responses' refers to the number of answers and not the number of people who responded, so don't relax just yet!

After the big event of the Draft Local Plan consultation, everything will seem to go quiet for a time while the responses are analysed, but the sharks are still circling and Ringmer is the bait. RAGE will continue to keep you informed via newsletters and suggest points to support your position. If you have friends and neighbours not yet signed up to help our village, please do your best to get them to do so.

UPDATE FROM LEWES DISTRICT COUNCIL

LDC Councillor Emily O'Brien says: "It's been a busy time at Lewes District Council. We held a successful meeting and 'thank you event' for the many different wildflower and 'friends of parks' groups across the district, which was well attended.

"We had a lively full council meeting, passing a balanced budget despite the difficult times. LDC is first council in the UK to pass a motion in support of 'Zane's law' for better regulation of disused landfill sites. Young Zane died ten years ago and campaigners blame his death on hydrogen cyanide poisoning leaking from a flooded former landfill.

"As ever, planning is a key area of concern for all of us, and I want to ensure there is the best possible engagement for the next crucial stage of the local plan. A draft plan will be sent out for consultation. More than 2,0000 responses were received to the recent consultation so a big thank you to everyone who responded.

"I've also been busy on the not unrelated issue of water quality and attended an LDC scrutiny panel. This was an opportunity to question the Environment Agency and Natural England. I've also been raising my concerns about likely further abstraction from the river Ouse when the second Arlington reservoir is built and am meeting Ofwat and Southeast Water about this issue."

NEWS FROM RINGMER PARISH COUNCIL



ROAD VERGES

We often get complaints about the state of the verges in the village. Sadly, the Parish Council has no power to address this issue. We have referred the problems to East Sussex Highways but it does not meet their criteria to repair. It is clear that as our roads have become busier with more parked cars, there are times when vehicles mount the verges as the roads are not wide enough to pass the parked cars. We would welcome any ideas that you may have on how to stop this happening and could we politely ask that we all, as residents, park courteously without causing damage to the verges.

SWIMMING POOL

Lewes District Council approved their budget in February and the revenue budget to support the running of the pool was confirmed.

POLICE REPORT

Each month we receive a report from our PCSO. It is disturbing to read that incidents of illegal or unruly behaviour occur so frequently. If you are a victim of, or witness, such behaviour, or have information that may help apprehend the culprits, please telephone 101.

FINGERPOST FIELD PLAYPARK

In addition to the construction of the new skate park, the Parish Council have accepted a quote to upgrade the playground area. It is hoped that both facilities will be available for the summer.

SUSSEX NATURE RECOVERY

Local Nature Recovery Strategies (LNRS) are a statutory requirement from the Environment Act 2021. Their aim is to protect the important places for nature that are left, and identify the opportunities to restore or create it, where it can have the most benefit for wildlife and people. East Sussex have started mapping existing and potential protected areas. The Parish Council have completed the 'group' survey, which is open to any local organisations supporting wildlife. There is also a survey for individual residents to complete. With so much threatened development it will be important to protect and develop our wildlife areas. To find the survey type 'sussexnaturerecovery' into your search engine.

JUBILEE GARDENS

We're hoping to work with Goldcliff Garden Centre to re-stock the two flower beds that have been rather neglected. If any resident would like to help with the planting and routine maintenance of the Jubilee Gardens, please contact the Clerk in the Parish Rooms on 01273 813242.

WILDFLOWER RINGMER SPRING NEWS

The rainy weather has delayed our usual maintenance and planting work but it is underway now! The good news is that robust clumps of plants can be seen that have survived the winter and become really well established.

VILLAGE GREEN BANKS

Work is underway to reduce the amount of grass to give the wildflower plants a better chance. In previous years, the grass was strimmed in February but it was just too wet this year to do that so you may spot volunteers pulling up grass while carefully avoiding the wildflowers. We are also planting more of the species that we know do well here: Devil's-bit-scabious, Field Scabious, Ragged robin, Ox-eye daisies and Evening Primrose.

WELL-HOUSE

There are good signs of germination in the three enlarged beds, which are sown with colourful cornfield annuals such as poppies and cornflowers.

NEW WAR MEMORIAL BED

We are not so confident of a good display here this year unfortunately. There has been some trampling on the soil that has damaged seedlings and also the area is very waterlogged. We have tried to salvage this by sowing fresh seed in late March. Fingers crossed it works.

SADLERS WAY GREEN

Spring has sprung here with a lovely display of violets, primroses, cowslips and celandines. This area will face disruption soon from works by Southern Water relating to the new development off the Lewes Road. We are working with Ringmer Parish Council to minimise the damage to our areas.

East Sussex is home to iconic and wondrous wildlife, but nature is in trouble. One in six of our UK species is at risk of extinction and urgent, ambitious and locally coordinated efforts are needed to reverse this decline.

This is where Local Nature Recovery Strategies (LNRS) come in. A new England-wide system of plans to help nature recover, each LNRS will agree priorities at county level. There will be one strategy

covering East Sussex and Brighton & Hove and a separate one covering West Sussex. Once published, they will join with the remaining 46 across England to form a nationwide strategy. The point of these is that people who live in each county can contribute.

How to get involved

You can take the LNRS survey online – head to sussexnaturerecovery.org,uk to find the questions – there are 20 in total. There are surveys for landowners, for Sussex residents and for any groups and organisations already involved with nature's recovery, such as Wildflower Ringmer.

Please do contribute to these surveys if you can and get involved with a local group to help save our precious wildlife and natural environment. Without us, it won't survive!
