

ST MARY'S GARDEN PARTY



RINGMER WI UPDATE

Our speaker on 4 July was Kevin Marwick, owner of Uckfield Picture House who told the group all about the history of the building.



The half-timbered Tudor style building was built in 1912 and in 1916 was used as a garrison theatre for local troops. In August 1920 the lease was sold to the cinema in Foresters Hall and the Picture House started showing films to the public for the first time. It has operated continuously since, only closing for re- development and during the Covid pandemic. Always privately owned, the cinema came under the ownership of Kevin's father in late 1963. The first film shown under his management was Forty Pounds of Trouble starring Tony Curtis.

In 1977 the auditorium was split in half, with a new projection box and indoor toilets installed. In February 2000, a third screen was added by demolishing the stage end and extending the building. Subsequent renovations have improved seating in all three theatres and the foyer has been redeveloped. In 2018, it was voted Picture House of the Year. Kevin continues to seize opportunities, such as opening the Picture House Restaurant and, most recently, purchasing the country's oldest working cinema - The Electric Cinema in Birmingham.

On 1 August, we'll be visiting Michelham Priory with a guided tour of the house. The next meeting in the Village Hall will be on Tuesday 5 September in the Alan West Room. Our speaker will be Joy Dyson, who will give a background to the history of the Chailey Heritage Foundation. She'll tell us about the amazing things that happen there to support and help children and young people with complex neurological disabilities and health needs to reach their full potential.



ECO CHURCH TIP - REBUGGING THE PLANET

Global studies suggest that 49% of insect species are in decline. How can we help to counter this catastrophic decline in our insects? A book by Vicki Hurd called *Rebugging the Planet* makes some suggestions and here are just a few.

We can revise our attitudes and talk to our children in positive terms about insects: wasps pollinate plants, flies clear waste, slugs make soil, spiders spin fantastic webs and ants have amazing social skills.

We might help to organise a bug treasure hunt in the garden or wild patch of land and design a fun set of activities such as making drawings or observing insect behaviour like columns of ants or pollen searching bees. Or maybe with friends we could create a bee friendly, bug friendly area of the garden or help to build a bug hotel. There's an example behind the church in St. Mary's churchyard.

On 8 July we started the annual Summer Reading Challenge, aimed at children below 11, and we were pleased to sign up 12 kids on that very first morning.

Children need to read six library books over the holidays. It's an effective way to

maintain their reading progress through the long summer holidays.

This year The Reading Agency has linked up with the Youth Sport Trust to present the programme, which is called Ready, Set, Read. Children can pick up rewards for each book they finish and there's a medal at the end – it's always fun!

Our next monthly hearing aid maintenance service is on Thursday 17 August between 3 and 4.30 pm, where hearing aids, batteries and tubing can be checked and changed. The service is for patients of Brighton and Haywards Heath audiology departments, as well as Eastbourne.

We continue to run children's Storytime sessions on Thursdays at 2pm, and on the first Saturday of the month at 10:30am.

NEWS FROM RINGMER PARISH COUNCIL

PICNIC ON THE GREEN - Monday 28 August

Make a note in your diary of this date - Monday 28 August between 12.30pm and 5pm - and join the Picnic on The Green celebrations. A Fun Run will start the event (fancy dress is invited), followed by performances from two bands, stalls and food available to purchase. In the afternoon, there will be a 'fun dog show'. SKATE PARK UPDATE

We were pleased that the planning application for the skate park in Fingerpost Field was approved by Lewes District Council at their June planning meeting. However, there are certain conditions that have to be met before construction can proceed. The Parish Council have accepted a quote for the necessary Archaeological Survey.

SWIMMING POOL UPDATE

The latest information is that Wave Leisure are currently working on a specification of works that will feed into the lease between ESCC and LDS. LDC has held discussions with Kings Academy to understand their requirements and constraints and ESCC will update the commercial agreement. It is hoped that the project to re-open the pool will move forward fairly quickly to a lease.

PLAY AREAS

We've allocated funds to provide new play equipment and seating at Fingerpost Field. The PC has discussed improvements at Broyle Close, where some repair work has recently been completed, with LDC. A meeting with children from both Ringmer schools was held on 17 July to find out what they think should be purchased. A quote has been accepted to provide new social seating on the Village Green between the shopping precinct and Delves House. The target date for delivery and installation is Monday 14 August.

IMPROVING THE NATURAL ENVIRONMENT IN RINGMER

We've completed the survey of plant biodiversity at the Almond Field. An action plan to start developing the area was unanimously approved by the Council. Thanks to the support from the South Downs National Park Authority. Residents will be able to access the field in the future, but at the request of the family and to preserve wildlife habitats, dogs will not be permitted on the site.

Appeal APP/P1425/W/23/3318089 by Ashill Regen for Land between the Broyle and Round House Road, Ringmer, East Sussex (application LW/22/0255)

The hearing date is/was at 10am on 1 August 2023 at the University of Sussex Falmer. It's always great to have people attend on the first day of the hearing. Our concerns include its prior allocation (and planning permission) as an employment site plus 16 affordable rental homes in the Neighbourhood Plan being contravened.

Furthermore, the design is poor with a three-metre acoustic fence against the Caburn Enterprise Park that fails to adequately protect upstairs affordable flats, a lack of private space for the large detached houses planned along the western boundary, multiple identical pattern-book units in rows, only four tiny roadside play areas for small children. The whole layout plan is cramped because the development density is too high.

The outcome of the two Gleesons Appeals off Harrisons Lane/Potato Lane is not expected to be published for some weeks. We'll keep you informed when the result of the appeal is published. Join RAGE via our website (above) to be kept in the loop.

We're also waiting to hear about details for the next appeal for the Thakeham full application on Bishops Lane and will provide an update when we know.

WILDFLOWER RINGMER UPDATE

This summer has been the most successful one so far for our wildflower areas. Thank you to everyone who has given their time and energy to support this project.

We need to give the plants time now to finish flowering and set and disperse their seeds. The areas will look a bit brown and straggly but it is important to give them this time before cutting, which will be in late August / September before being raked up and removed. By doing this, we reduce the nutrients going back into the soil. This is part of our strategy for reducing grass growth which otherwise makes it difficult for wildflower species to survive and thrive. We will also scarify the ground to increase the chance of seeds contacting bare soil so they can germinate next year. The cuttings are used by a local market gardener to make compost so it is a win-win situation!

We are the lucky recipients of over 80 large native cowslip plants, which have been donated for planting in the wildflower areas. Due to the dry conditions we are delaying planting until September so that we can keep them watered.

We will be looking for volunteers to help with the following:

- Raking up grass cuttings for collection.
- Planting cowslips.
- Cutting back and extending the wildflower borders in the Well-House.

the difference that we made with a few hours work. In other news, we would like to thank one of our group who has recently hung up his shears after 20 years of footpath clearance. Brian originally started with the South Downs Committee then when that morphed into Ringmer Volunteers he continued the good work, we are grateful for his devotion to duty and good humour.

LOCAL COUNCILLOR NEWS & VIEWS

Emily O'Brien is LDC Councillor & Prospective Parliamentary Candidate as well as the Green Party Food, Agriculture & Rural Welfare Spokesperson. She says: "I attended the opening of the new A27 cycle and walking route to Polegate, which has been extremely well designed by National Highways and has been widely welcomed. Let's hope the County Council look to this example in their future planning on cycle provision.

"Our petition on HGV traffic, which specifically requested that the county council introduce a lorry route network, has been scheduled to appear at a lead member meeting in September. It's encouraging that ESCC apparently is hearing the pressure on this and is considering a road freight strategy as part of the next local transport plan, currently in development.

"I spoke at the Gleesons/Glyndebourne appeal and stressed that, as a ward councillor, I consider the traffic implications as unacceptable. I also referenced the motion that was unanimously passed at LDC stressing that the 'duty to connect' is failing in our planning system, our deep concern about sewage discharge increasing at Ringmer water treatment works and the links with new development.

"I had a wonderful tour of the wildflower planting areas with Wildflower Ringmer, and took two new councillors along so they could learn from Ringmer's experience for their areas.

"Finally, I attended the Local Government Association's annual conference and was disappointed when Michael Gove, when asked to provide clarity on timescale for the new NPPF– so vital for enabling area to progress their local plans - replied that it would be published alongside the Levelling Up Bill, when that is given royal assent. However, this is a completely unknown quantity and there are concerns that it might not even get there is in this Parliament."

Johnny Denis is LDC Councillor representing Ouse Valley and Ringmer for the Green Party and is a cabinet member for arts, culture, tourism & leisure. You can reach him at johnny.denis@lewes.gov.ukHe says: "At the most recent full council at East Sussex, the administration voted against a motion to follow national guidance on setting speeds. The Government guidance says feelings of safety, residents views and wellbeing can all be taken into account. The Council considered its policy was fit for purpose but has agreed to consider adding speedsetting to its work programme at its next Scrutiny Meeting."


