

VILLAGE UPDATES



Ringmer Against Greenfield Exploitation

Thakeham's appeal has been upheld and a "public consultation event" for Thakeham 2 has already been held. Feedback shows that the

consultation questionnaire is rejected unless you respond to the tick-box questions. It's best to wait for the full application before submitting comments. RAGE will alert you when dates are published. The next stage of the draft Local Plan is in progress. LDC have produced a report covering both new policies and also potential site allocations. There will be another required public consultation, scheduled to run from 29 November 2023 to 8 February 2024, with results in June 2024. The document will also include links to the site assessments, which need to be reviewed. Note that these are not final, may change and can be challenged. The new policies are also vital as they determine how applications will be assessed and include for example a new policy about water quality. Any help gratefully received! RAGE will update you when these are available but it is important that you respond to the consultations and we will try and summarise the main points and the potential impact on Ringmer.

The Boklok hearing has been deferred to 9 January 2024 due to staff/consultant availability - venue to be confirmed. This appeal relates to the refused application for 70 properties at Lower Lodge Farm adjacent to the recently allowed appeal from Ashill-Regen for 53 properties and north of the existing Round House Road development. The Orchards extension of eight market properties (LW/21/0667) on a greenfield site at Lower Clayhill has come back to life after two years absence but has been amended to eight custom build properties. Any comments you made then will have to be repeated now to carry any weight. The Parish Council at its last meeting agreed unanimously to recommend refusal. Work continues in The Almond Field with the planting of native wild flower species. Work on removing diseased ash trees was delayed due to the recent storms. Now is the time for planting spring flowering corms and bulbs, crocuses and alliums are the only species that support the early season pollinators.


