

ST MARY'S PRAYER RUG MINISTRY

Since February 2013, a small group from St Mary's have been knitting and stitching to make prayer rugs. While working, they pray for the people who will receive the rugs and scarves they have made.

When completed the rugs and scarves are blessed during a Sunday service and given on behalf of all the congregation to assure those who receive them of our prayers. Since the group started, 140 items have been completed, blessed and given and have been much appreciated by the recipients.

A sample from the thank you cards reads: "Thank you so much for the cosy and pretty little rug you

prayerfully made together for me. It did seem to have an extra glow when I put it on my knees" and "... as I fingered each square and the clever edging I felt such a warm wave of prayer and love from the knitters... it is giving me so much comfort and help."

RINGMER HISTORY GROUP

The February meeting is on Friday 24 February in Ringmer Village Hall at 7.30pm where Brian Short will speak about 'The Turbulent Foresters of Ashdown Forest'. The seeming tranquillity of the countryside can hide a combative history and the stories of Ashdown Forest in the Sussex Weald, and more locally of the Broyle in Ringmer, are of conflicts over the centuries between different groups, each with their own priorities. A common theme is aristocratic landowners and wealthy incomers interested in hunting, mineral exploitation and private enjoyment seeking to restrict traditional common rights, but there could also be disputes between commoners with different interests. The struggle for Ashdown Forest continues today amid ongoing development pressures.

NEWS FROM RINGMER PARISH COUNCIL



KING'S CORONATION | SAT 6 MAY 2023

The Parish Council held an initial meeting recently to discuss possibilities to mark the Coronation with the Brownies, Ringmer Evergreen Club, WI, Village Hall, Village Library, Barn Dancers and the schools. Village celebrations will follow on from the Coronation

ceremony, which will be screened at the Village Hall. Potential plans include a party for primary schoolchildren with commemorative mugs donated by The Lord of the Manor Gus Christie, entertainment on the village for residents of all ages, refreshments in the Church Rooms, an ice cream van, a beer tent, Maypole dancing, bell ringing, musical entertainment and an evening barn dance. SOUTH EAST WATER is considering the construction of a large reservoir between the Broyle and Laughton Road. Consultation deadline is 20 Feb 2023.

RINGMER AGAINST GREENFIELD EXPLOITATION



Ringmer Against Greenfield Exploitation BOKLOK, Land to the South of the Broyle LW/22/0282 (70 residential dwellings)

Let's start with some good news! Lewes Planning Committee voted unanimously to refuse this application at Lower Lodge Farm. Thanks to all who submitted objections enabling councillors to understand our concerns.

OVESCO NORLINGTON LANE SOLAR FARM Despite a request from our MP, the Secretary of State has not called in this application, so it will go ahead. Residents were divided on this, but this is devastating news to those of us who enjoy the rural charm of this part of the village.

CROUDACE, BROYLE GATE FARM (100 houses on three fields)

Disappointingly the developer's factic to escalate this application to a formal Appeal without waiting for a decision from LDC was successful so this development on a greenfield site will go ahead. We will wait to see what is offered in terms of the community sport and leisure facilities which are part of the package.

GLYNDEBOURNE/GLEESONS (200 homes off Harrisons Lane)

Following LDC's refusal of the amended plans for 75 homes, Gleesons have submitted an Appeal for the original application for 200 houses. Gleesons will have a strong team to make their case so as soon as the Appeal is validated we must submit our objections to help the Planning Inspector understand why this proposal is so wrong for our village. UPDATE FROM CLLRS EMILY O'BRIEN AND JOHNNY DENIS



NEW NATIONAL PLANNING POLICY

Emily says: "Johnny and I spoke against the Boklok development at the December planning committee and welcomed the government U-Turn on housing targets just days before. The new National Planning Policy Framework is out for public consultation and I hope that Ringmer Parish Council put a response in. I'm working with the Association of Green councillors to digest the

consultation and help develop a response and am very happy to work with others and compare notes on this huge and somewhat daunting task. I have also written to MP Maria Caulfield asking her to support the suggestion that the new NPPF should address the five year review rule on local plans. I also asked if previous appeal decisions will be overturned, given the new focus on reducing the number of appeal overturns. If not, then are there going to be any reparations/compensation for communities like ours that have been affected by such appeal decisions under the existing rules? She confirmed there will not.

"In my Green Party role as Food, Agriculture and Rural Welfare I attended the Oxford Real Farming Conference in early January. I'd be pleased to hear from farmers, food producers and community projects including food banks as I am doing a tour of these - please do get in touch. I am very aware of the continued pressures caused by the ongoing wet weather and will be keeping a close eye on potential flooding as well as the ongoing issues with Southern water's unacceptable discharge of untreated waste water into rivers and seas at the merest hint of rain."

Johnny Denis adds; "There is no further news on Ringmer Swimming Pool beyond the commitment in December by LDC to do its utmost to bring our pool back into use. LDC continues to work with East Sussex County Council and Wave Leisure, to see how this can be done. Hopefully a more formal announcement will be forthcoming in due course. The biggest issues recently include the exceptional flooding followed by the freeze in January. Multiple properties struggled with backed up sewage, some having to have a tanker pumping out sewage. The cause seems to be a non return valve on the sewer from the village to the water treatment plant combined with volume of sewage and run-off.

"The freeze also left vehicles stranded or crashed at various points on the A27 and other roads as temps have dropped."


