

## LETTER FROM ST MARY'S



#### Dear Friends

So that was Christmas! Another year starts and soon the Christmas decorations will be packed away. Unless, like the church, you leave them up until the end of January. We do this because the season of Epiphany, which starts on the Twelfth Night of Christmas and continues through January, is when we remember the visit of the wise men to the child Jesus and for the next weeks we remember the revealing of Jesus as God's son in

various ways. It is the second half of the wonder of Christmas - the realisation of just what the gift that we receive at Bethlehem truly means for us and for our lives.

Parking close to the venue is very limited, but free. The surface is poor and seriously puddled in wet weather.

"It's commendable that you're taking steps to address your situation. Remember, you're not alone, and support is available.

"Start by gathering all information about your debts, including contracts, bills, and statements. Create a comprehensive list detailing each debt, including the creditor's information, missed payment dates, amounts owed, and any actions taken by the creditor. Prioritize paying essential bills like rent, mortgage, energy, and Council Tax to avoid serious consequences.

"Communication is key. Reach out to your creditors to discuss your situation and explore manageable steps to reduce your debt. Once you have essential bills under control, address other debts like credit cards and payday loans.

"Consider potential sources of income by checking for eligible benefits, including support for energy and living costs. Citizens Advice offers a benefits calculator and advice on reducing living costs on their website. Additionally, explore emergency support options such as food banks, fuel vouchers, and assistance from Lewes District Council.




