

### LETTER FROM ST MARY'S



### Dear All,

This time last week I was sitting in a small café in Corinth, Greece, looking out over deep blue water and sipping an iced coffee. Today in my study I'm warming my hands on a mug of tea and looking out over an overcast day. But I know that, with each passing day, Spring is closer and the warmth I felt last week will be here with us. As we go through the year I am in constant danger of looking forward to the next thing. Right now I'm looking forward to Spring – to the bloom of flowers and the buds

of blossom on the trees. While the blossom still lies on the trees I'll be waiting for Summer, for the heat and warmth of the long days. Then it won't be long before I'm thinking of getting the fire ready for the Autumn evenings - hot chocolate and thick jumpers while watching the flames dance in the fireplace. Then it will be Christmas soon and before I know it I'll be waiting for the February half term and our annual week in Greece. Wow, a whole year passed and my tea is still hot! I am learning, ever so slowly, to appreciate today. To spend just a minute looking out of my study window and appreciating the day that I'm living right now. To wait for tomorrow and to live in today. There is that old saying that goes something like: "Yesterday is gone, tomorrow is not yet, today is a gift – that's why it's called the present". At the heart of this is the wisdom that I'm trying to learn. To live in today, in the moment. To be present today with the specialness of today. So if you see me sitting on a bench around the village it will be because I've stopped for a short time just to admire the beauty around us before I continue. Maybe you will join me on the bench for a minute or two?

### **RINGMER HISTORY GROUP**



John Kay says: "Our meeting this month will be held at 7.30pm on Friday 17 March in Ringmer Village Hall and will feature four short talks by members. I will describe the evolution of Ringmer Old Churchyard and, inspired by Geoff Bridger, try to estimate just how many people have been buried there over the centuries.

"Hilary Smith will tell the story of her great-grandparents Edward and Mary Ann Evenden. They were born in Mayfield but lived in

Ringmer for more than 40 years, celebrating their Diamond Wedding here in 1908.

"Anna Kay will tell us about domestic life in late Victorian and Edwardian Ringmer, based on oral histories collected from older villagers in the 1980s. Finally, Mike Howell will tell us about the 1951 crash of the experimental Hawker P1081 jet fighter near Swingate that resulted in the death of the test pilot, war hero Squadron Leader Trevor Sidney 'Wimpy' Wade (pictured front and centre above in 1941).

"Our one-day Ringmer History course in February attracted more people than we could accommodate in a single session, so will be repeated in the autumn, probably on a Saturday in late September or early October."

### **RINGMER AGAINST GREENFIELD EXPLOITATION**



### RANGERS FARM, CHAMBERLAINES LANE, FORMAL APPEAL

**Ringmer Against** Greenfield Exploitation The Planning Inspector dismissed the appeal, hopefully setting a precedent for future appeals. The Inspector gave significant weight to the proposal's adverse impact on the surrounding countryside and the narrowing of the green gap between Ringmer and Broyleside particularly as Croudace has been approved. Thanks to all who attended and submitted objections. GLYNDEBOURNE/GLEESONS (200 homes off Harrisons Lane)

Both appeals (for 200 houses and the revised 75 houses) are live on the Planning Inspectorate website (Ref. APP/P1425/W/23/3314192). If approved, either development would change the rural nature of Potato Lane forever, bring unacceptable urbanisation to this part of our village and have a severe negative impact on the setting of the South Downs National Park. In addition, as the proposed access is next to the school on Harrisons Lane (existing bungalow to be demolished) there are road safety concerns for children entering and leaving the Primary School. Despite these strong arguments, we would be foolish to take refusals for granted. Gleesons will have a strong team to make their case. It is important that we submit our objections before the deadline of 23 March to help the Planning Inspector understand why this proposal is so wrong for our village. Emily says: "On the endless saga of Ringmer and planning, I was absolutely delighted that the Appeal Inspector upheld the LDC decision to refuse the Bedford Park development – a chink of good news! I am keeping my fingers crossed for the Averys development where I attended and spoke as a Ward Councillor.

"We continue to be really busy around planning more widely. I'm coordinating a response to the current government consultation on behalf of the local green party and also developing a template response to be shared with Green Councillors round the UK.

"Aside from planning, I attended the Lewes District Cost of Living summit, and have given evidence to an all party parliamentary group. The Council support available locally is listed at under 'Cost of Living Crisis' at lewes-eastbourne.gov.uk. As part of my district wide visits to Warm Spaces and Food Banks, I had a wonderful visit at Ringmer Library to see how theirs is progressing – it really is a warm welcome for everyone and I'd encourage residents to pop by for a cup of tea. See page 15 for their opening hours.

"I've also paid a visit to the Community Land Trust housing being built at Neaves Lane. It's great to see such good progress on this and the Mill Road house under construction for a family with specialised needs. Along with Johnny, I continue to support Mill Road residents who remain concerned about flooding that they believe is from the Caburn Field development. ESCC has agreed to an independent investigation into these issues."

Johnny Denis adds; "We are delighted that funds were set aside by Lewes District Council at its annual budget setting meeting for bringing Ringmer Swimming Pool back into use as part of the Council's wider investment in leisure facilities across the District.

"This aims to set just a 1% budget increase for Council services and providing both a 100% Council Tax Rebate Scheme and continuing to provide further support for those hit hardest by the cost of living crisis."

### WILDFLOWER RINGMER



Anne Duke writes:

You may have seen in the news that King Charles hosted a palace event in February backing action on biodiversity. Biodiversity – the variety of living things – is declining faster than at any time in human history. Biodiversity is in crisis across the globe and, according to experts, the UK isone of the most nature-depleted nations in the world. It's easy to feel overwhelmed by this and powerless. But there are things that we can do on a small scale to help.

Brighton and Hove City Council have recently published their Wilder Verges Project Report. Under this project, 23 verges were left uncut during the 2022 growing season from March to September to provide food and shelter for wildlife. When survey data from August 2021 was compared with corresponding data for August 2022 it's easy to see the positive difference not cutting has made:

- Nearly half (48%) of the sites saw an increase in number of pollinator or wildflower species present
- Ten out of 23 sites (43%) saw the amount of pollinator species increase
- Around 70% of the verges (16 out of 23) recorded a pollinator or wildflower species not seen at all in 2021.

We are adopting a similar approach in the wildflower areas on the Village Green banks and at Sadlers Way Green. Cuts will be restricted to either side of the growing season. his change in management allows more and different wildflower species to flourish.

Road verges within the village can have a surprising number of wildflower species too. Violets, daisies and dandelions are all good food sources for pollinators. These verges have two official cuts a year only but are often kept close-mown by residents. We would like to encourage residents to mow less frequently to give wildflowers a chance to flower and set seed.


