

LETTER FROM ST MARY'S

Dear Friends

In 1994, Elton John sang: "It's the circle of life..." Many years earlier, in 1789, Benjamin Franklin said: "Nothing is certain except death and taxes." We've learnt in the recent past that, while tax can sometimes be avoided (but not evaded), the certain truth is that death can not be avoided by any of us. The circle of life is one of birth and death.

The reason that I start my letter to you with what seems like a dark and dismal theme is to introduce a conversation that we must have. The New Churchyard of St. Mary's (new nearly 100 years ago) is getting fairly full. I estimate that we have about five years of burials left in the space we currently have. It is therefore sensible to ask where we will bury Ringmer residents when this space is full. If you have been in the churchyard, you will see that it is an important place for families and friends to remember their loved ones. Every time I go into the churchyard I, meet people tending graves or sitting quietly. I believe it is important that we have a place in the village to lay Ringmer people to rest, so that others are able to visit and to remember - and not have to travel to do so.

The church doesn't have the resources to buy any land for this purpose and the days are long gone (thankfully) when the church would simply commandeer the land from others. If anyone has any ideas for a suitable place in the village please do let us know. We know that the circle of life will turn for us too and we want to be sensible and pragmatic about the practical implications of this.

RINGMER CHURCH ECO GROUP ECO TIP - KNOW YOUR PLASTICS

If you took part in the big plastic count last year, how many items of plastic did your household count? According to Which in November 2022, the average UK household disposed of 66 pieces of plastic each week.

Much of this is recycled but there is a difference in the recycling value of different types of plastic. Clear plastic milk bottles, made from high density polyethylene (HDPE), are very recyclable and can be turned back into milk bottles. PET soft drinks and water bottles are also easily recycled and manufacturers are required to use a proportion in new bottles.

However, PP Food containers, such as yoghurt pots and food trays can't be reused in food manufacturing but can be used in other gardening or household plastics. Low density polyethylene (LDPE) is usually less recycled. However, LDC state on their website that they will collect carrier bags and sacks (not black) and plastic covering (for example, from batteries and toys). Major supermarkets in Lewes also collect soft plastics - just ask at the till for the collection point.

PLANNING UPDATES FROM RAGE



We are delighted that, following months of anxiety, the were dismissed by the Inspector on

17 October 2023.

On 16 October we viewed the final session of the Thakeham Appeal where the design fails in many areas and the access challenge has not been met. The Inspector complimented the way in which the Rule 6 Party (Ringmer Parish Council represented by Councillors John Kay and Linda Grange) conducted their case. The next appeal is the BokLok Estate on Tues 14 November. We don't yet know the venue and all previous representations are declared to be carried forward.

Neighbours in the areas where appeals have been upheld (Chamberlains Lane and Roundhouse Road) may consider setting up groups similar to the North Ringmer Residents Group and Caburn Fields to ensure developers and builders comply with conditions laid.

The presentation for the Neaves Lane solar farm (now named Old House Farm) took place over two days. If this is granted it may be some years before construction is started.

Lewes District Council will be discussing the draft Local Plan and their preferred options for sites at a Cabinet Meeting in Newhaven on 9 November, followed by a discussion at Full Council on 20 November. The proposals then go out for public consultation for ten weeks from the end of November through to February 2024.

The over-arching problem remains at national level. One of the few laughs during this whole doleful process was when John Kay referred to this as the "twisted" balance rather than the "tilted" balance.

We end by thanking all those who supported the efforts to defend our village - MP Maria Caulfield, District Councillor Emily O'Brien and County Councillor Johnny Denis and residents who submitted objections both in writing and in person. There is no doubt that the Inspector understood the strength of feeling in Ringmer.

NEWS FROM RINGMER PARISH COUNCIL



REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY – 12 NOVEMBER

There will be a parade on 12 November. Lewes, Glynde & Beddingham Brass Band will lead, from the car park behind the shops at 10.45am, via Springett Avenue and Lewes Road to the War Memorial. The maroon will sound at 11am followed by a two minute silence, after which a bugler will play Reveille. The names of the

fallen will be read from the Memorial followed by prayers. The church service will follow from 11.15am to 12.15pm. The parade will reform and march back to the car park where it will play again and then disband.

SKATE PARK UPDATE

The planning permission condition on landscaping is being worked on.

SWIMMING POOL UPDATE

County Councillor Johnny Denis reported that while some detail is still being discussed, it's anticipated that the pool will reopen in Spring 2024.

VILLAGE AMENITIES

Work has been completed on the new bus shelter at the West bound Village Green bus stop. We are discussing installation of real time bus timetables at some stops. The seat between Delves House and the shops has been installed. We are discussing the rejuvenation of the shopping precinct with the shop owners and the landlord and have set aside some funds.

IMPROVING THE NATURAL ENVIRONMENT IN RINGMER

We have accepted Wildflower Ringmer's proposals to increase the size of the existing wildflower beds in the Pump House and to cut a new bed next to the Memorial Bench on the Village Green. The new bed will be sown with a poppy rich seed mix. Work continues in The Almond Field with the planting of native wild flower species. Work on removing diseased ash trees will take place this month.

PLANNING MATTERS

We are pleased to report that the proposed development to build up to 200 houses on land adjacent to the Nursery & Primary School will not take place after the developer's appeal was rejected by the Planning Inspectorate.

LOCAL COUNCILLOR NEWS & VIEWS



Emily O'Brien is a local Lewes District Council member & Prospective Parliamentary Candidate as well as the Green Party Food, Agriculture & Rural Welfare Spokesperson. She says: "Last month, the County Council finally considered the petition organised by local councillors and residents calling for action on HGVs using villages and country roads as short cuts by introducing a 'lorry route network' to encourage HGVs onto A roads and away from villages, narrow streets, and residential areas. We all support our local HGV drivers and welcome local deliveries, but too many HGVs are using areas like Ringmer and Glynde as a 'rat run'.

"We're pleased that the County Council have, to an extent, listened and at least agreed to look at a new freight strategy which just may look at restricting HGVs on certain roads. They said they would start work "early next year".

"It's also good news that LDC's decision on the Harrison's Lane Glyndebourne/Gleesons development was upheld by the inspector. I've been appointed LDC's water champion and attended a panel hearing with questions to Southern Water about the unacceptable amount of sewage discharge form Ringmer Water Treatment Works."
