

LETTER FROM ST MARY'S



Dear Friends

I have yet to find a job description for Churchwarden but the role is certainly a very varied and interesting one! Writing this piece, with a very short deadline, wasn't on my 'to do list' but it does give me the chance to fill you in on a couple of challenges that being Churchwarden currently presents.

'Jumping through hoops' is what we seem to be doing while obtaining the final plans and quotes to install heating in the Church. Hopefully, now that the church has a fully functioning and certified electrical system, the Diocese will grant permission for the heated seat cushions to be fitted to the pews and for new electric heaters in the choir vestry and Church Room.

'It never rains but it pours' is the saying that comes to mind following the theft of lead from the Church Room roof. Unfortunately, the lead was not treated with Smart Water and therefore the cost of the repair is not covered by our insurance and we will have to dip into our reserves to cover the cost of the repair. Our architect is busy looking at possible alternatives to lead to make it less attractive to thieves. Hopefully an acceptable solution will be found quickly.

While on holiday in the South of France I saw enormous churches facing major building repairs and restoration, which made me feel that at St Mary's we are very lucky that our 'problems' are relatively small. We have a dedicated team that keep our church open and welcoming, do pop in and enjoy the peace and beauty of our village church. In the meantime, let us hope that we have a long, hot, dry September and October!

ECO CHURCH TIP – SUSTAINABLE FASHION

Of the 150 billion garments produced a year, 87% end up in a landfill or an incinerator smouldering or polluting the air. Just 1% of all discarded clothing is actually recycled. Today we buy 60% more items of clothing on average than we did 15 years ago, but we keep them only half as long. The result? The clothing industry is responsible for 4% of greenhouse gas emissions...

What can we do?

- Educate yourself about sustainable clothing.
- Buy less and shop for quality over quantity.
- Choose natural materials organic cotton, linen, or hemp.
- Buy 100% recycled fabrics 100% recycled polyester, viscose (rayon), etc.
- Buy second hand clothing.
- Swap clothes with a clothes swap group or start a swap yourself.
- Repair your clothes yourself. The longer clothes are kept, the lower their emissions footprint.

The Summer Reading

From November, the library will once again be open on Friday afternoons too and we will restart Energy Advice sessions – the first is Saturday 16 September at 10 am.

We're now signed up to the Green Libraries Manifesto, run the Chartered Institute of Librarians and Information Professionals. We believe that libraries are a very sustainable way to read and are mindful of green issues. All home deliveries are on foot and we drive just once a month to collect stock. We even reuse our plastic book covers! Apart from lending jigsaws and books, we have magazines that are free to take and we are the only local collection point for free compost bags from Lewes District Council. Our unwanted books are collected by WOB, a carbon neutral company that rehomed almost 16 million books in 2022. Check out our book sale trolley for bargains – prices start from a £1 and all funds raised benefit the library.

NEWS FROM RINGMER PARISH COUNCIL

SWIMMING POOL UPDATE

ESCC and LDC are working together to get the right property agreements in place to allow Wave Leisure to operate a renewed pool as soon as possible.

VILLAGE AMENITIES

New social seating is now in place on the Village Green between the shopping precinct and Delves House. Work should now have been completed on the new bus shelter to be installed at the West bound Village Green bus stop.

IMPROVING THE NATURAL ENVIRONMENT IN RINGMER

Residents may have noticed a change in the footpath running along the side of the New Cemetery. This is part of the work required to provide access for residents to The Almond Field. Gates will be fitted when the legalities of the transfer of ownership are competed. The Parish Council, with the approval of Bill Almond's family, has applied to the South Downs National Park Authority (SDNPA) to identify the field as a 'Call for Nature' site. This will enable the field to be developed to increase wildlife habitats thus increasing the plant and animal species diversity. A path to allow residents and school groups to walk through the field will be cut. At the request of the family and to preserve wildlife habitats, dogs will not be permitted on the site.

PARKING ON THE VILLAGE GREEN

Reminder: parking is not permitted anywhere on the green except off North Road for the cricket club.

LOCAL COUNCILLOR NEWS & VIEWS

She says: "Our full council meeting in July passed motions regarding Southeast Water and also on enhancing air quality, both unanimous. More recently I addressed the appeal hearing in Falmer for the Ashill Regen development asking that the Inspector outlining my objection to this proposal. I've also been liaising closely with the Cabinet

Member for Planning who has confirmed that the Thakeham appeal will be robustly defended. I am a member of the local plan steering group (where cross party councillors input into process) and continue to remind officers of the need to progress the next Local plan, which remains challenging when on top of all the other obstacles, the promised guidance is once again delayed.

"In my cabinet role we have had issues with our contractors not fulfilling their mowing duties in the District's parks and I'd like to apologise for anyone who has experienced this. The contractors are now on a stringent performance management plan and are almost back on track. I've also had a lot of complaints about verges and overgrown cycle and footways, which I've passed to the County Council. I've also asked for a review of how we manage the District-run cemeteries to makes sure we are getting the right balance between managing for nature (e.g. Lewes cemetery is designated as a local wildlife site) and ensuring that these very special places are respected and that people are able to pay respects to their loved ones

"A reminder, as I am not sure this message is getting across, that if anyone is unable to access their loved one's plot they should contact the council and a mowed access path will be provided and maintained. You are also welcome to contact me personally to request this. I've also asked the review to look at signage and whether it is clear that this is an offer we make and also whether it's clear that there is active management for wildlife in the wild areas.

I visited the Wood Store, a local timber re-use project (on Ringmer side of A26 just up from ESSO garage - the Avery's nursery site) - do check them out if you are after some good value timber, all saved from landfill or incineration! They also welcome local volunteers and can help people learn skills - so important for the green jobs of the future! They need local trustees and a more permanent site as the current one at Averys is obviously up for re-development. Do contact the group if you know of any suitable low cost commercial or farm buildings."




